<p>Cattle born, reared and slaughtered in the UK</p>	<p>All ages</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> The tonsils and intestine from the duodenum to the rectum; and the mesentery; <p>Over 6 months</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> The entire head (excluding the tongue, but including the brain, the eyes, trigeminal ganglia), thymus, spleen and spinal cord. <p>Over 30 months</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> The vertebral column, excluding the vertebrae of the tail, the spinous and transverse processes of the cervical, thoracic and lumbar vertebrae and the median sacral crest, the wings of the sacrum, but including the dorsal root ganglia. - in the UK this only applies to Beef Assurance Scheme animals, all other cattle over 30 months of age are excluded from the food chain.
<p>Cattle all member states except UK</p>	<p>All ages</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> The tonsils, the intestines, from the duodenum to the rectum, and the mesentery; <p>Over 12 months</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Skull excluding the mandible but including the brains and eyes, and spinal cord.
<p>Cattle (in all Member States except UK and Sweden)</p>	<p>Over 12 months</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Vertebral column, excluding the vertebrae of the tail the spinous and transverse processes of the cervical, thoracic and lumbar vertebrae, the median sacral crest and the wings of the sacrum, but including the dorsal root ganglia .
<p>Sheep and goats (applies to UK and all other Member States)</p>	<p>All ages</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> The spleen and the ileum <p>Over 12 months (or permanent incisor erupted)</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Skull including the brains and eyes, tonsils, spinal cord.
